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Numerous non-playing Adult members on medication for Heart, Lung, Liver and Kidney and other Conditions; Asthma, High Blood Pressure, etc. A significant number of members suffer from Arthritis including one non-playing juvenile.

Previously it was at discretion of Adult Player or parent of Juvenile Player whether to complete Cardiac Screening form. From 2009 this has been compulsory for all players.

Club has defibrillator and at least one trained user per mentoring team.

All teams are accompanied to games by either practising nurse or trained first aider. At least one member of each management team has undergone a pitch-side first aid course.

Mentors of a group with a young person with medical condition are made aware of condition and medication with permission of parent / guardian on a confidential basis.
